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SUMMARY

<p>Point 2</p>	<p><u>WG1</u>: Next meeting 18.7.2024, followed by a summer break for the next 3 weeks until the week of 12.8.2024 (exact date TBD).</p> <p><u>Stakeholder engagement plan</u>: ENTSOs will publish an updated version until 20.7.2024. The comments of the WG1 to the updated plan were shared among SRG members for comments. The process was finalized, the voting process is the next step. The voting period will start on 19.8.2024 and will last until the 13.8.2024. The results will be shared at the SRG weekly meeting. This takes into consideration summer vacation time and allow the new SRG member from the European Biogas association (EBA), Mieke Decorte to vote after she joins the group on 5.8.2024.</p> <p><u>Innovation Roadmap Document</u>: content and timeline will be discussed in the next meeting on 18.7.2024.</p> <p><u>Economic Variants</u>: Feedback from the SRG on economic variants is expected to be shared until 23.7.2024. The form of the feedback is in discussion with the ENTSOs, as the timeline is very tight. A formal and concise consideration shall be possible until end of August, including a potential voting process.</p> <p>Next discussion topic will be the cut off dates.</p> <p><u>WG2</u>: Collection of charging data for EV passenger cars and trucks ongoing. Next step are concrete proposals for modelling and a joint workshop with the specialists from the ENTSOs in August (date still to be defined).</p> <p><u>WG3</u>: The work continues after the decision on the Innovation Roadmap, data quality checks are ongoing and a workshop was organized with the ENTSOs to better understand in greater details how wind is modelled in the scenarios.</p> <p><u>WG4</u>: The next meeting will take place after the summer break end of August. A feedback to the ENTSOs on the current modelling of CCS and CCU is planned as the first output of the WG. To collect feedback from members a template will be created and distributed before the summer break. Parallel to the work in WG4 the “Industrial Carbon Management Forum” https://energy.ec.europa.eu/topics/carbon-management-and-fossil-fuels/industrial-carbon-management_en (formerly CCUS Forum) is active on the same topics as WG4. The Forum is organized by the stakeholders in the field of CO2 transport, CCS and CCU to give feedback to the EU Commission on the upcoming EU Industrial CCS/CCU strategy. Some members of the SRG and ENTOSOG are active in several working groups of the Forum. To avoid duplication of work between the SRG, the ENTSOs and the Forum a meeting is scheduled with on the 23.7.2024 to compare the topics and discuss about further collaboration. This can be relevant for topics that will be picked up in the Innovation Roadmap for the 2026 scenarios, as they might have been pre-developed in the Forum and results could be used by the SRG.</p>
<p>Point 3</p>	<p>SRG membership: European Biogas Association (EBA) was approved by ACER and DG Ener. The membership of the SRG contains now 24 members. The convenors were also contacted by Amazon to join the SRG, the process of application has started following the official procedures.</p>
<p>Point 4</p>	<p>Members of the SRG voiced interest for a tool to track how recommendations, advice or opinions from the SRG are taken into account by the ENTSOs for the TYNDP 2026 cycle. With this tool potential improvements of the overall process can be identified. Ideas on the tool will be shared by the SRG in August. The convenors plan a meeting with the ENTSOs to achieve a better insight which of the recommendations/advice/opinions were incorporated in the work and how the process can be optimized, if necessary.</p>
<p>Point 5</p>	<p>The abstract for the application to speak at the ECEMP conference in October was delivered on time.</p>
