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Summary

Point 2	<p>WG1:</p> <p>Economic variants: A hybrid workshop for all SRG members takes place on September 24th, 2024 at the ENTSOG premises in Brussels. Also national TSOs have the opportunity to join.</p> <p>Innovation Roadmap: in the WG meeting on the September 17th, 2024 the comments from the SRG members on the Innovation Roadmap's draft of the ENTSOs were discussed. A consolidated feedback will be delivered until September 20th, 2024 to the ENTSOs. This feedback shall be understood as comments and suggestions for improvements from the involved SRG members and not as the SRG position on the Innovation Roadmap Document.</p> <p>The ENTSOs continue to refine the qualitative assessment to prioritise different innovations for the 2026 TYNDP cycle and add further details to the ranking calculation and the choice of tools/models. To bridge the different opinions, the SRG is asked to develop independently its own scoring system. For the final publication a transparent methodology should be agreed between the ENTSOs and the SRG. All work should be finished within 3 weeks to publish the innovation roadmap before the planned Webinar mid-October. The feasibility of this exercise in regard to the given timeframe will be scrutinized by the SRG members.</p> <p>WG2: The EV modelling recommendations were added to the Innovation Roadmap draft.</p> <p>For reference heating data a meeting is planned in the following week to clarify open questions.</p> <p>WG3: No update.</p> <p>WG4: In the meeting on the September 18th, 2024 the questions from the ENTSOs and ESABCC were discussed. It was concluded that CCU and CCS cannot be modelled only based on top-down parameters but must be modelled implicitly. In addition, other emissions – e.g. process emissions – shall be modelled with emission factors, which the WG will help to collect. The carbon budget management discussion will continue parallel to the data collection process.</p>

Point 3	<p>Membership: EU turbines will propose a new SRG member. The SRG thanks Giovanni Amalfitano for his engagement.</p> <p>SolarPower Europe has expressed interest to join the SRG and the official process will started according to the SRG's ToR.</p>
Point 4	<p>After the publication of the innovation roadmap a webinar is foreseen for mid-October for the broader public. The Innovation Roadmap for the 2026 cycle and the proposals for the economic variants will be presented. No public consultation is planned from the side of the ENTSOs. The Innovation Roadmap for the 2028 cycle will be consulted next spring.</p>
