Summary

Point 2

WG1: A preliminary feedback session was held the day before on the upcoming public consultation for the TYNDP scenarios. The SRG is preparing a joint document with feedback on the questionnaire to provide general input or suggest clarifications to specific questions. All SRG members are invited to contribute and the deadline for submitting contributions is Friday, 23rd May.

ENTSO-E noted that they will be circulating slides that explain the criteria used to build the reference grid. There will be a chance to discuss these in more detail in a follow-up meeting. While SRG input is welcome, it's not yet clear how much of that feedback can be taken on board.

Regarding the Innovation Roadmap, WG1 drafted a document that includes several headline points and SRG members have until Wednesday 28th May to review the document and add any further comments, additions, or suggestions.

WG2: A meeting next Monday from 2-3 PM will take place to look at demand projections, particularly how fuel types and technologies are distributed across different sectors. These projections are based on assumptions made by TSOs in different scenarios, so the group agreed it would be useful for SRG members to take a closer look, benchmark the figures, and flag any questions. Before the meeting, the chair will circulate a list of indicators for review. The meeting will also include a discussion on how best to investigate the demand – whether at EU level, individual countries or just a selection. After the meeting, the list will be recirculated for any additional comments from SRG members.

WG3: Following the second workshop on hydrogen and synthetic fuels, a document is being drawn up with comments, questions, and clarifications, which will be open for SRG input until Tuesday 27th May. The document will then be shared with the ENTSOs. The next weekly meeting is on Thursday 29th May and members are invited to suggest discussion topics, particularly in view of the upcoming public consultation.

No major updates from **WG4**.

Point 3

ENTSO-E's new Stakeholder Engagement Specialist gave a short overview of her role. She explained that she's there to support open communication between ENTSO-E and groups like the SRG, making sure feedback loops are in place and that stakeholder perspectives are integrated into ENTSO-E's planning and decision-making. She's also working to promote more transparency, trust, and collaboration across the board. Someone raised a question about whether ENTSOG has a similar role or counterpart.
