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Summary

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| Point 2 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two applications for vice-convenors were received and shared with SRG members the day before, together with the agenda. As in last week's convenor election, it was proposed to proceed by acclamation rather than a vote, given the quality of the motivation letters and to simplify the internal SRG process. • Members supported proceeding by acclamation and thanked both candidates. With no objections, the two candidates were elected as SRG vice-convenors for the 2028 cycle. A short coordination call among the convenors and vice-convenors will be scheduled. |
| Point 3 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Following last week's meeting, the documents of new Ember's representative were circulated and no objections were received within the period, so he has been officially approved as Ember's representative in the SRG. • The formal change will be reflected in the publicly available SRG membership list, and ENTSO-E will be notified by email once this is completed. |
| Point 4 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Innovation Roadmap survey deadline passed last Friday (19 June), with a small extension this week; four replies were received. Although the turnout was low, the responses will be consolidated with the feedback gathered during last year's consultation to feed into the Innovation Roadmap for the 2028 cycle. • The survey results and first thoughts on shaping the new Innovation Roadmap are foreseen as an agenda point at the 8 July workshop; the input is being assessed, with more expected in about two weeks. As the survey link has been reactivated, members were strongly encouraged to still submit responses by the end of this week. |
| Point 5 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ENTSO-E presented the updated draft agenda for the 8 July kick-off workshop (with support from ENTSG). The full-day workshop will be held at ENTSO-E's Brussels offices with an online option. As the first semi-public workshop of the 2028 cycle, it aims to gather SRG feedback on the previous cycle to start shaping 2028, with takeaways from the 2026 cycle presented by the project managers; ENTSG and ENNOH will take part as full stakeholders of the scenarios product for the first time, and the European Commission has been asked (not yet confirmed) to give an introductory presentation on the policy and regulatory context. |

	• After the introductions the agenda covers the Innovation Roadmap, followed by rotating breakout sessions on modelling methodologies, the ETM/visualisation platform, demand modelling, flexibility modelling and CO2/carbon markets, the gap-filling methodology (lessons learned and improvements), and the stakeholder engagement plan (how the SRG will be involved, the timeline and public consultation), closing with a tour de table and the way forward. • A member unable to attend asked for recording the workshop; it was agreed to record the plenary parts (welcome and the EC/ACER presentations), though the breakout sessions (around 14:00–15:00) may not be fully recordable. The draft agenda will be shared after the meeting so the SRG can match its proposed topics and potential contributors against availability; next week's meeting will be extended by 15 minutes to specify SRG contributions and possible session leads.
AOB	• A question was raised about the SRG tracker for the upcoming cycle – whether to continue the current format and who will take ownership. As the SRG is still reorganising following the vice-convenor elections, it was agreed to address this under the stakeholder engagement plan at the 8 July workshop. The meeting closed with a reminder that next week's session will be 15 minutes longer.
